

Dr. Robyn V. White is a native of Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. She graduated from Temple University (Philadelphia, PA) with a Bachelor of Science in Exercise Physiology (2000). After completing a year in the Temple University Doctorate of Physical Therapy Program, Dr. White decided to pursue nursing. Enrollment in the United States Navy Health Professions Scholarship Program (HPSP) proved to be an excellent decision. It posed as a launchpad into her nursing career. Dr. White graduated from York College of Pennsylvania's nursing program with a Bachelor of Science in December 2005 and was directly commissioned as a United States Officer.

After completing Officer Indoctrination School at Newport, Rhode Island, Dr. White reported to her first assignment at National Naval Medical Center in Bethesda, Maryland. She served from 2005-2011, delivering primary nursing and post-anesthesia care in a fast-paced, 20-bed multi-service care unit (MSU). Her responsibilities included providing medical care for active duty and retired military veterans, as well as combat trauma care to those injured while serving in Operations Iraqi Freedom and Enduring Freedom. After 18 months as an MSU staff nurse, she transferred to the Intensive Care Unit (ICU) where she served as both staff nurse and charge nurse. As a critical care nurse, she managed combat trauma, immediate post-op cardio-thoracic surgery care, wound care, conscious sedation, neurosurgery, general surgery, and complicated medical critical care patients.

In 2008, Dr. White was deployed to Kuwait. She provided care to U.S. and coalition forces in support of Operation Enduring Freedom (OEF) and Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF).

In December 2010, she deployed to Haiti aboard USNS Comfort, providing care to over 171 critical pediatric patients devastated by the hurricane. As the team leader, Dr. White coordinated discharges to land support efforts.

Upon her return from Haiti, Dr. White was stationed at Fort Belvoir Community Hospital (FBCH) from 2011-2014, where she managed 25 civilian and military staff members in a busy pediatric clinic.

Dr. White attended Uniformed Services University, Graduate School of Nursing from 2014-2017, and graduated with her Doctorate of Nursing Practice (DNP) in 2017. Dr. White is currently a board-certified Family Nurse Practitioner specializing in women's health. Her awards include a Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal, and personal commendations.
